Share a selection of Books, E-books, and Children's Stories from your Collection

Choose themes that for all levels of readers that relate to misinformation, social cohesion, overcoming differences and sharing perspectives.



Host a (virtual) event – live or pre-recorded

This could be a webinar, workshop, story-time, quiz, or panel discussion – share information on your learning tools and resource selections, or highlight different perspectives in a panel discussion.



Create a learning tool for your users

Compile a variety of resources that offer information, references, or lesson material on MIL into a (digital) resource pack or libguide.



Engage with your community on social media

Share news and resources, be sure to tag #GlobalMILWeek to join the global conversation.



Team up with local media, community organisers, and local leaders

Discuss the “trust factor” and how different actors can help nurture trust in your own context.



Get involved with MIL on Wikipedia

Host a virtual edit-a-thon or work on creating/updating/translating Wikipedia entries on MIL topics.
